I. STUDENT ETHICS COMPETITION RULES

Competition Process

Below is a breakdown of the competition process. The remaining section of this document will address the details needed to complete each step:

- 1. Create your team and register for the competition
 - Each branch can have 1 team in this competition
 - Teams must be 3-4 students
- Arrive at SoutheastCon by the start of the competition to compete
 Details on the competition timeframe will be posted with the SoutheastCon agenda.

What to expect

Each team must have 3-4 students.

For prelims

- Prelims round will be a written essay.
- One student on each team will serve as a designated grader and be separated from the rest of the team.
- Teams will receive an ethics prompt and have 45 minutes to write a short essay. During this time, graders will attend a brief ethics workshop to prepare for grading.
- After the 45-minute writing period, all essays will be collected and handed to the graders, who will be in a separate room. The essay writers will be dismissed at this time.
- Teams are not allowed internet access when writing the essay and may only use Microsoft Word on their computers. After 45 minutes, teams must upload their essays to a Google Drive folder. Each team and grader must have a separate laptop with Word and internet access.
- Each grader will be assigned three essays to grade. Grading will be blind: graders will not know which team they are evaluating, and no one will grade their own team's essay. Each essay will be graded by three different students, and the average score will determine the team's final score.
- The top 4 teams will advance to the finals. All students must attend the entire prelims competition. The grading role will take at least 1 hour longer than the writing portion.

Student Ethics Competition Rules

For finals

- The finals round will consist of a presentation, and only teams that advance to the finals are required to attend.
- Each team's grader will rejoin their team for the finals, and all students must arrive on time to compete.
- Teams will receive the finals prompt when the finalists are announced Friday evening. Teams will have until 10 am on Saturday to submit their presentation. Teams will then be assigned a 30 minute time slot to present their presentation to judges. The presentation shall be 8-10 minutes and the remaining time will be to allow for questions.

What to bring

Each team should have two laptops for prelims (one for the grader and one for the essay writers) and one laptop for finals. All laptops must have internet capability, MS word, and MS power point. The laptop used for finals must be able to connect to HDMI. Students are responsible for bringing their own power cables and it is recommended to have an extension cord.

How to Prepare

Students are advised to review the IEEE code of ethics and know how to trace case facts to the code. The IEEE code of ethics will be provided to students in the prelims and finals.
